FireSmart Spring Clean Up

Athabasca County, in cooperation with the Athabasca Regional Waste Management Services Commission (ARWMSC) and the area summer villages; is planning a FireSmart project again this May to help property owners with their FireSmart spring clean-up. The project will include the "Free Hazardous Fuel Disposal Weekend"; all waste transfer sites will waive the fees to ratepayers for disposal of waste brush and trees for a week around the long weekend in May. This program has been a very cost-effective way of encouraging FireSmart practices.

ARWMSC will conduct this FireSmart initiative, around the May long weekend holiday (21st to the 31st). The program will be advertised in the newspaper and on the web, prior to the May long weekend.

Note: this includes appliance disposal and residents can use the Town of Athabasca facility as well.

Monthly Property Tax Payments

We have had several inquiries about whether or not you can pay your property taxes monthly. You can pay property taxes monthly, but only if you are pre-paying for next year. Current amounts due are still payable by July 31 and anything owing as of that date is subject to interest. Once you have cleared off the current taxes you can make pre-payments on next years taxes in whatever amounts you would like.

Election

2021 is an election year. Nomination day is June 19. Please contact Kim if you are interested in running to get a nomination form. Nomination forms will only be accepted by appointment due to covid. If there is an election required it will be held on July 17.

Bears and Cougars
